# Introduction



This past year has been the start-up year for the China International Development Research Network (CIDRN). Looking back, much has been put in place since the first meeting of the Network in July 2013, attended by all of the initial 24 members and by members of the International Advisory Committee (IAC).

We can certainly say that the CIDRN now exists, one year later, as a very active circle of people, research and policy discussion, with the circle growing wider through the year – two further members joined (Institute of European Studies, Chinese Academy of Social Sciences and School of Public Policy and Management of Tsinghua University) and there were multiplying interactions with the adjoining circles of our members. And the management structures and the hosting and financial arrangements are now all fully functioning.

The major achievements of the start-up year are detailed in the records contained in this first Annual Report. Here are some highlights:

A research programme has been put in place, with 9 research grants awarded (selected from 17 applications). This has involved setting up the processes for calls for proposals, together with selection criteria and approvals, via initial review by the Management Group, then International Advisory Committee project assessments, and final approval by the Strategic Oversight Committee (CAU, MofCom and DFID). Research projects now being financed include: the organization of China's aid; China's positioning in the UN post 2015 development strategy negotiations; China's interaction with African development; and the effectiveness of China's support for agricultural development in Africa.

Twelve CIDRN Public Events have been held, in different locations, including presentations by several members of the International Advisory Committee and an address by the UK Secretary of State Justin Greening.

A website is up and running with a basic home page describing the objective and processes of the CIDRN, and interaction with members and the wider public.

Newsletters communicate current and planned activities of the Network and of individual members of the Network.

A set of Policy Briefs by senior members of the CIDRN is being launched.

The IAC has benefited greatly from two field trips organized and led by Prof. Li Xiaoyun and his team; the first to observe village resettlement and large scale irrigation in Ningxia and the second, in 2014, to witness and learn from the industrialization process in Zhejiang Province engaging farmers in dynamic processes of rural-urban cluster development based around small products and networking with global reach, transforming a poor farming province into a prosperous workshop for the world. These field visits are proving immensely valuable in helping the IAC in its guidance role and promoting the work of the CIDRN internationally.

At the September 2014 Annual Meeting, researchers will describe and discuss their progress to date, with the full membership of the CIDRN present, together with the International Advisory Committee. A keynote address will be delivered by Prof. Hu Angang on the topic of "China and the World: from the chaser of modernization to the contributor of human development (1980-2013)".

The Annual Meeting will also set the scene for a second call for proposals, drawing on experience to date, with additional guidance on the preparation of proposals and further refinement of the assessment process conducted by the International Advisory Committee. By next year there will be a growing number of final outputs to be published and policy briefs to be prepared.

As Chairman of the International Advisory Committee in this first year I would like to thank my fellow members for their contributions, and to pay tribute to all those involved in the successful launch of the CIDRN under its Chair Prof. Li Xiaoyun and its co-Chairs Prof. Li Anshan and Dr. Zhou Hong, including the hosting role of the Research Centre on International Development at the China Agricultural University, under its Director, Prof. Wang Yihuan, the financial contributions from DFID, the support of the Ministry of Commerce of China, and especially, the active participation of the 26 member institutions of the CIDRN and all those who submitted research proposals.





CIDRN is an informal learning and exchange platform to boost high quality policy and theoretical researches by Chinese researchers on China's role in international development and its engagement with other developing countries.
