Concept note

Overall theme of the Forum 2021

It is increasingly evident that the climate crisis is an actual and imminent threat. Thus, the announcements of the three countries in North-East Asia in 2020 to commit to carbon neutrality (China by 2060; Japan and ROK by 2050) were perceived as a major step by the international community¹. Russian Federation is also considering to scale up its effort to reduce the Green House Gas emission².

How such momentum and commitment are reflected in their strategies to support developing countries through development cooperation will have a significant implication for sustainable economic recovery path and GHG emissions of the development cooperation partner countries. At the same time, countries around the world are still in the middle of responding to and recovering from the current health emergency.

Thus, the Forum will highlight how development cooperation of North-East Asian countries contributes to strengthening the risk resilience of partner countries in post-COVID-19, embracing a broad spectrum of the risk resilience, including mitigation of GHG emission, strengthening the health system, etc.

Description of the sessions

Session 1: (led by JASID)

Title: Changing face of development cooperation in post-COVID19 era

COVID19 pandemic revealed a panoply of "inconvenient truths" in advanced countries – abysmal inequality, a lack of social cohesion, government's inability to employ scientific expertise, and a distrust between the government and the people, to list a few. This may fundamentally change the face of development cooperation predominantly informed by the "mainstream" development thoughts that has long touted the advanced economies as the political and socio-economic model for the developing world.

Session 2: (led by KAIDEC)

Title: The SDGs in the post-COVID19 era for regional development cooperation

The session will share what Republic of Korea (ROK) government would do for achieving SDGs after COVID 19, especially in Northeast Asian context. The speaker will introduce ROK policy toward NEA -New Northern Policy- and discuss how to coordinate this policy for SDGs in this region after COVID 19.

Session 3 (led by CIDRN/CIDGA)

Title: East Asia Poverty Alleviation Experience and its Implications for other developing countries

The session will share China's poverty alleviation experiences and explain what China has learned from other Asian countries and explore the implications of these experiences for other developing counties in the post-COVID-19 era.

Session 4 (led by RAEDAE)

Title: Russia's Role in Achieving the SDGs in the Post-Covid-19 Context

The session aims to highlight the actions Russia has undertaken nationally and internationally to advance sustainable development in the post-COVID era. How do the Russian government's anticrisis measures contribute to attainment of the SDGs? How does Russia support developing countries and strengthen their resilience as they face the intertwined health, economic, and social effects of COVID-19? What efforts have been made to ensure affordable and equitable access to vaccines? What is the actual scope and composition of Russia's contribution to sustainable development? What factors will likely determine its policies over the Decade of Action?

Format of the Forum

Each session is expected to have one presentation, followed by interactive discussion by the participants. The presentation may be followed by a limited number of discussants (panellists) to set the tone of discussion and stimulate interaction with the rest of the participants.

About the North-East Asia Development Cooperation Forum

The Forum was initiated by ESCAP East and North-East Asia Office to facilitate analytical discussions on policies and practices of development cooperation in North-East Asia as well as potential areas of collaboration among North-East Asian countries.

Since the first Forum in November 2014 in Seoul, the Forums have been organized as joint endeavour of partners in the North-East Asia, namely China International Development Research Network (CIDRN), Japan Society for International Development (JASID), Korea Association of International Development and Cooperation (KAIDEC), as well as a group of Russian researchers that became Russian Association of International Development Assistance Experts (RAEDAE) since its formal establishment in 2016.

The Forums brought together researchers and practitioners of development cooperation from the four countries as well as recipient countries in Asia.

The past Forums were jointly organized by ENEA Office and the partner networks taking turns in hosting the Forums most often with other local partners³.

- Republic of Korea Seoul in 2014 and 2018, in collaboration with KAIDEC
- Japan Tokyo in 2015 and 2019, jointly hosted by JASID and JICA Research Institute
- China Suzhou in 2016 jointly hosted by CIDRN and Department of International Cooperation in Development Research Center (DRC) of the State Council of China
- Russian Federation Moscow in 2017, Russian Association of International Development Assistance Experts (RAIDAE) and the Russian Presidential Academy of National Economy and Public Administration (RANEPA)

Partners profile

ESCAP ENEA Office is a subregional office of ESCAP, covering 6 member states (China, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Japan, Mongolia, Republic of Korea, and Russian Federation) and 2 associate members (Hong Kong, China and Macao, China).

China International Development Research Network (CIDRN) is a network of Chinese scholars interested in international development from different disciplinary backgrounds such as international relations, development studies, economics and other related fields have formed an informal network to share their research both amongst themselves and with policymakers in China, and beyond.

Japan Society for International Development (JASID) is an academic society that tries to bring together knowledge and experience about international development and cooperation from multiple disciplines, ranging from economics and management to politics, sociology, anthropology, agriculture, technology, medicine, and so forth.

Korea Association of International Development and Cooperation (KAIDEC) is an academic association of scholars from academic institutes in multidisciplinary subjects, government personnel working in development cooperation, private sector business personnel in charge of overseas investment, and field workers of NGOs. Russian Association of International Development Assistance Experts (RAIDAE) is association of researchers and practitioners of development cooperation in Russian Federation officially established in 2016. The association was initiated by the researchers who participated in the first North-East Asia Development Cooperation Forum in Seoul in 2014.
